## Fractured Flowers Supply List

Supplies:

- Backgrounds Choose at least 4 coordinating fabrics. Choose tightly woven fabrics for this project.
- They are less prone to fraying and therefore work better for the stitching we are going to do after fusing.

You will need 5/8 yard of each.

- Flowers: You will need four 4" squares for the flower centers
  - Flower 1 (spikey petals)
    - (I used 9 fabrics for this flower. You may choose as many as 14 coordinating
    - fabrics.) You will need at least two <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yd cuts, but you may use scraps at least 9" X 9".)
  - Flower 2 (Japanese petals)
    - (I used 19 scrap pieces for this flower. You may choose as many as 28 pieces from scraps measuring at least 9" X 9" or make your cuts from at least two ¼ yd cuts.)
  - Flower 3 (Impressionist petals)
    - Outer radius: 1/3 yd
    - Middle radius: Twelve 4 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares (These can be taken from two 1/8 yard cuts
    - or from scraps.)
    - Interior radius: Four 5 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" squares
  - Flower 4 (Mexican pottery petals)
    - Big Petals: 1/4 yd
    - Medium Petals: 1/6 yd
    - Background petals: 1/6 yd
    - Big Circles: Four 4" squares
    - Small Circles: Four 2" squares
- Fusible web (I suggest Soft Fuse or Heat and Bond Lite but any light weight double sided fusible of your preference will serve well): 4 yds

Sashing material:

Top: ½ yd Bottom: ¾ yd Batting: Throw size or scraps equaling the size of your backing fabric squares and borders Backing Material: 2 ½ yds (Cut sixteen 12 ½" squares from the backing fabric – you will need at least 4 of these in class)

Binding: 1/2 yd

Sewing machine in good working order capable of doing a series of decorative stitches

Microtex (sharp) machine needles (80/12 is best)

Paper cutting scissors

Good sharp fabric cutting scissors

Pencil

**Rotary Cutter** 

Cutting mat

#1 safety pins

masking tape (not blue painter's tape)

Pressing cloth (any large scrap of muslin or similar fabric will work)

100% cotton DMC machine embroidery thread in a variety of colors (a 100% cotton

Mettler or Gutterman will also work for some types of decorative stitches, but you will have greater flexibility to use a variety of stitches with the two ply DMC)

Prior to class: Cut a 22 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" square from each of your background fabrics
